Dear Friends



Merry Christmas from your friends at The University Church. We pray that this letter finds you safe and healthy.

Since the beginning of the global pandemic The University Church has been constantly reimagining what it means to be the Church in our community. We continue to ask:

- What challenges are facing our neighbors today?
- How can we adapt to meet the needs around us?
- How can we continue to share the love of Christ in a tangible and meaningful way?

Change is not something that churches are typically known to embrace, but thankfully, YOU are not a typical church. Light on your feet and agile in your thinking, YOU, our church family, embraced change, took on new challenges, and showed up in a big way!

The Great Pivot – our ongoing response to the global pandemic:

- Our Rogers High School after-school program moved online to continue to support students with tutoring, social emotional learning, and special events like cooking classes. Today, our after-school program is back in-person, following the safety protocols set forth by our school district.
- Early in the pandemic, our Rogers High School and Reynolds Elementary School HUB
 Directors quickly identified several urgent needs in our community and responded by
 creating distribution programs that provided food and hygiene items to families in need.
- The University Church's own food pantry did not miss a single Third Thursday distribution as we transitioned to a delivery and drive-up model, while protecting volunteers and food pantry clients through social distancing and masking.
- Our Community Health Worker continues to meet a growing need through her work with pregnant women and new mothers, connecting with clients online and over the phone.
- For 16 months our church family moved to an online format for Sunday worship gatherings.
 During this time The University Church's children's and youth ministry team created virtual
 spaces for Sunday school, book club, and game nights. Returning to in-person gatherings
 has been a joy, made possible by the safety precautions we continue to practice.
- During the height of the pandemic, new friends gathered online to read and discuss a total of 4 anti-racism books during the course of our virtual book club.
- Our community garden provided a safe and educational environment for 6 first-year medical students, 3 summer AmeriCorps VISTA members, 1 fulltime AmeriCorps VISTA member, and many other volunteer groups. Persevering through the pandemic, our garden team continued to provide food to our community through our CSA and other food distribution programs and even installed a prayer garden filled with beautiful native plants.
- Staff meetings, church Leadership Team meetings, trainings, and committee meetings moved to an online video format to help us continue the work of the church.

Where do we go from here?

Today, community life, church, volunteering, and even education look quite a bit different than they did before the pandemic. What hasn't changed is our shared commitment to ushering in the Kingdom of God here on earth.
